

Energizer and L.P.I. Resolve Trademark Lawsuit

ST. LOUIS, April 4, 2007 /PRNewswire-FirstCall via COMTEX News Network/ -- Energizer Holdings, Inc. (NYSE: ENR) and L.P.I. Consumer Products, Inc. announced today that the lawsuit filed by L.P.I. against Eveready Battery Company, Inc. and Schick Manufacturing, Inc., both subsidiaries of ENR, in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida, in which L.P.I. asserted trademark infringement with respect to the term "all in one" and Eveready and Schick sought cancellation of L.P.I.'s trademark registration, has been amicably resolved and dismissed. All settlement terms are confidential.

L.P.I. Consumer Products, Inc., headquartered in Pompano Beach, Florida, is the manufacturer of "ShaveMate" brand razors which feature a patented combination of shaving cream inside the razor's handle -- ShaveMate "Diva" for women & ShaveMate "Titan" for men.

Energizer Holdings, Inc., headquartered in St. Louis, Missouri, is one of the world's largest manufacturers of primary batteries and flashlights and is the parent company of Schick-Wilkinson Sword, the second largest manufacturer of shave products in the world.
